THE PROGRAM

Structure

As participants, you will complete the program in a cohort, supporting one another and sharing experiences and insights. Courses are designed and sequenced to help you grow in your spirituality and leadership abilities.

The program begins with an intensive two-week, six-credit summer seminar at Marymount University in Arlington, Virginia. Over the school year, you will complete online coursework, connecting with your colleagues through online chats and collaborating on projects.

During the second summer, you will return to campus for another two-week session and six credits of coursework. In the following school year, you will complete your online coursework and engage in a comprehensive project, internship, or thesis.
