## Dr. Cassandra Good

*Charting the Heirs of America's First President*

Dr. Cassandra Good, Assistant Professor of History and Politics, recently completed a six-month fellowship with the Fred W. Smith National Library for the Study of George Washington at Mount Vernon (also known as the Washington Library). This was her second fellowship from the institution to support her book project, *First Family: George Washington's Heirs and the Making of America*. Fellows are chosen in a competitive process by a committee of historians who specialize in early American history. Most fellowships are for one or three-month terms, but Good was awarded one of three six-month, \$20,000 fellowships in 2019.

The Washington Library provides fellows with offices only steps away from shelf after shelf of books on George Washington and his era. In addition, the Library has an extensive collection of Washington family manuscripts. Being on the grounds at Mount Vernon offers fellows unparalleled access to the house itself and a vast collection of objects, not to mention the expert historians and curators on staff. Good worked closely with staff to share new research finds, ask for expertise, and collaborate on projects.

Dr. Good first started researching *First Family* while working on her first book, *Founding Friendships: Friendships Between Men and Women in the Early American Republic* (Oxford University Press, 2015). *First Family* tells the story of Washington's step-grandchildren, the Custises, whose remarkable lives paralleled America's story in its first century – military triumph and tragedy, democracy and old aristocratic ties, visions of liberty alongside the horrors of slavery. While George Washington had no children of his own, his wife Martha had four grandchildren born of a son from her first marriage. This quartet – Eliza, Martha, Eleanor (Nelly), and George Washington (Wash) Parke Custis – grew up with the first president and, after his death, asserted their place as Washington's true heirs.

Uncovering the story of this family from the American Revolution to the Civil War required years of extensive research in a few dozen archives spanning from Boston to New Orleans. Using letters, diaries, newspaper articles, and museum objects, Good is reconstructing the Custises' story for the first time. She published an article in the peer-reviewed journal *Early American Studies* in Winter 2020, and is now in the process of writing a 10-chapter book.

Dr. Good's fellowship at the Washington Library provided her with the time and resources to write the first four chapters of her book. Her partnership with the staff at the Library and Mount Vernon as a whole is ongoing, and she recently took her students on a virtual field trip led by a curator with whom she is collaborating. She has also brought new research finds into the classroom. For Good, research isn't an end in itself – it also offers valuable source material and new ways of thinking to bring into her teaching at Marymount.

## Dr. Uma Kelekar

*Understanding the High Costs of Dental Care in the U.S.*

The expensive costs of dental treatments in the U.S. are no secret. Whether it's just a regular cleaning or something as serious as a root canal, dental work is necessary throughout one's life. But while some insurance, like Medicaid, covers the cost of dental treatments for young children, it does very little for adults.

The research of Dr. Uma Kelekar, Associate Professor of Health Care Management, has been focused on influencing public policy makers, as well as patients, about the impact that dental hygiene and treatment has not only on the overall health of an individual but also on the cost associated with dental emergencies that could be avoided with preventative care. She strives to bring awareness to this challenge.

Five years ago, her interest in the area of oral health care was propelled by funding she received from the Dental Trade Alliance to complete a literature review on the connection of oral health to overall health and health care spending. In her paper, *An Unexpected Strategy for Reducing Health Care Costs*, she highlights the importance of regular dental care and how it can save billions of dollars a year for the U.S. health care system and patients themselves.

From that, she also published an article in which she analyzed a national data set concerning the utilization of dental care among adults. She discovered that emergency department (ED) visits for dental emergencies cost approximately \$1,000, as opposed to regular dental visits that hover around \$200. Her most recent research looked at opioid prescription in emergency departments compared to other prescriptions for handling pain.

Dr. Kelekar, who holds a Ph.D. in Public Policy from George Mason University and a master's in Economics from the Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics in India, teaches graduate-level courses in health care reimbursement, health economics, data analysis, and epidemiology at Marymount.

"My background in economics greatly influenced my research interests. This has helped significantly when it comes to handling large sets of data in national databases," she said. "Other than my background, external funding opportunities gave me the incentive to work extensively on my research."

Dr. Kelekar explained that the first funding from Dental Trade Alliance and her second, from DentaQuest, resulted in ever-expanding opportunities to meet and collaborate with new people with similar interests, thus providing increased opportunities to become immersed in this research area.

"The results that I find can be generalized to a pretty large population across the country," she added. "My research has implications for policymakers largely, especially those that are advocating for more comprehensive dental coverage, particularly under Medicare or Medicaid."

Dr. Kelekar's work has been instrumental in influencing public policy and continues to be used as a resource to promote the importance of oral health on Capitol Hill. She has published her work in some of the top health journals such as *Journal of American Dental Association*, and *Preventive Medicine and Preventing Chronic Disease*.

In the future, Dr. Kelekar is looking forward to continuing her research related to contributing factors to dental health.

"I am excited to move forward as this research requires not only ED data but merging data from other county-level characteristics as well."

She is also planning to explore the effects of COVID-19 on different ethnic groups in nursing homes.

# Dr. Kathleen Garces-Foley

*The Impact of Societal Change on Religion*

Dr. Kathleen Garces-Foley, Professor of Religious Studies at Marymount University, has a very active research agenda examining religion and social change in the contemporary United States. Her research explores how individuals, communities, and institutions are responding to rapid changes in the nation's social life, and includes topics like young adults and religious congregations, new funeral rituals, the hospice movement, and multiethnic churches. Her qualitative methodological approach allows for in-depth exploration of beliefs, practices, and values across a wide range of religious groups.

She has published articles, books, and book chapters on the topics of racial diversity in churches and spiritual care for people who are experiencing an advanced, life-limiting illness receiving hospice services. Dr. Garces-Foley reports that she is currently writing a journal article “on a study of end-of-life companions or death doulas.” She explains that her most recent book, *The Twentysomething Soul: Understanding the Religious and Secular Lives of American Young Adults*, combines interviews with more than 200 young adults and a national survey of 1,880 people in their 20's to introduce readers to the many ways American young adults are living purposefully, responsibly, and reflectively.

Currently, Dr. Garces-Foley is a co-investigator on a study funded by the Lilly Foundation, Inc., titled, *The Landscape Study of Chaplaincy and Campus Ministry in the United States*. This three-year project is directed by sociologist John Schmalzbauer of Missouri State University's Department of Religious Studies. Dr. Garces-Foley is joined by Rebecca Kim of Pepperdine University, David Sikkink of the University of Notre Dame, and Catherine Hoegeman of Missouri State as co-investigators in this national study.

Dr. Garces-Foley reports that the goal of this research project is to “map the landscape of chaplaincy and campus ministry in the United States, paying close attention to how they are weathering dramatic changes in American social and religious life over the last decade. For example, how has the increase in anxiety and loneliness, racial and religious diversity on campuses, and rise in the numbers of students who are religiously unaffiliated affected campus ministries?”

The advent of COVID-19 has presented new and unanticipated challenges for campus ministries. Dr. Garces-Foley reports that their research will now include an examination of how COVID-19 has affected the work of chaplains and chaplaincy.

“The chaplaincy and campus ministry project allows us to explore the work of chaplains and campus ministers with a wide range of groups, including ethnic-specific ministries, Christian study centers, campus ministers from historically black denominations, and chaplains from other religious traditions.”

Her research will focus on campuses in the Washington, D.C., area. Because of COVID-19 and the need for social distancing, the majority of interviews and observed events will now occur virtually.

In the future, Dr. Garces-Foley is looking forward to exploring the lives of those who identify as spiritual but not religious, and how they “create meaning through communal religious practices.” She also plans to continue to study end-of-life spiritual care through an in-depth, comprehensive, and long-term examination of hospice care in the region.

# Student-Faculty Summer Research Projects

For the past several years, Marymount has provided summer stipends to a number of faculty-student teams to work on a faculty-directed research project. Each team has functioned separately with little interaction across teams. This changed in the summer of 2020.

The faculty-student research activities took on a different look in 2020, both because of COVID-19 requiring a completely virtual format and because of an enhanced focus on building community and collaboration among the research fellows and the faculty mentors. Dr. Amanda Wright, Professor of Biology & biochemistry and a 2020 MU Leadership Fellow, worked with Dr. Joseph Provenzano, Director of Instructional Design, to design weekly research-based workshops attended by all student research fellows and many faculty mentors. The workshops enhanced knowledge and provided community-building opportunities for students and faculty as students shared their research plans, findings, frustrations, and breakthroughs.

18 students were supported with summer research fellowships. The research projects covered a wide range of topics, from immigration to finance to theater to pandemic-related issues.

Both students and faculty gave very positive feedback. A few student comments:

*“It changed the way I viewed the timing of research...I learned that even when I finished the fellowship, there was still much work and endless possibilities of subjects and fields to research...I personally liked that part of my experience.”*

*“Being a Marymount Summer Student Research Fellow was my first experience doing research. I have never done a comprehensive research project. This Summer Research Fellowship...made me very interested in pursuing future research opportunities in my academic career and beyond.”*

*“This has been one of the best experiences of my life, and if granted the opportunity to be a Student Fellow, I would do it [again] in a heartbeat. I really enjoyed the program.”*

# Dr. Amanda Farrell

## *Treating the Invisible Wounds of First Responders*

The first people we call when we encounter a dangerous problem are first responders. They are in the front lines and few people really think about what the first responder is going through. The focus is entirely on addressing the crisis.

However, Dr. Amanda Farrell, Associate Professor of Criminal Justice, does not forget to think about them.

“As a blue line kid, and someone who has worked in the field, my research focuses on three broad areas: stress, trauma, and resilience in the expanded first responder community; issues related to criminal investigations; and best practices in teaching criminal justice students.”

Dr. Farrell includes a wide range of careers in her definition of first responders, including law enforcement, fire, EMS, dispatchers, crime scene personnel, forensic scientists, victim advocates, medical examiners, and coroner office personnel. She recognizes the impact trauma and stress can have on the lives of first responders and wants to raise awareness.

Her experience in the criminal justice field started at an early age. Being a member of a first responder family influenced her career path and research interest. As an undergraduate, she interned with the Metropolitan Police Service in the United Kingdom.

“I started to see some of these issues and eventually did my doctoral dissertation on what happens to an officer and their personal and professional networks in the aftermath of an officer-involved shooting,” she explained.

In the 2019-2020 academic year alone, Dr. Farrell served as a consultant and active contributor on a Report to Congress, published two peer-reviewed journal articles, gave five peer-reviewed presentations, and completed six invited presentations and workshops on topics associated with the needs of first responders. She was also invited to serve on the editorial board of *Psychology of Men and Masculinities*, a journal published in affiliation with the American Psychological Association.

The Needs Assessment of Forensic Laboratories and Medical Examiner/Coroner Offices: A Report to Congress (2019) was a product of over two years of work with Dr. Farrell serving as a consultant, technical writer, and subject matter expert on a Department of Justice project.

“I helped consult on and participate in stakeholder engagement, identify promising and best practices, prepare for and attend listening sessions for stakeholders, organize the documents, resources and materials for the project, as well as maintain the references list for the project and perform some data analysis.”

Dr. Farrell acknowledges that her first responder communities of interest continue to expand, and now includes anthropologists (research in development), forensic scientists and crime scene personnel (research in progress), undercover assets (research in progress), and medical examiners, medicolegal death investigators, and autopsy technicians (research in development). For this reason, her research is extremely broad.

“The groups that I research and present training with represent multiple perspectives and disciplines, but we all have first responder experience, which means that we are typically more accepted in that community.”

As for the future, Dr. Farrell sees a clear path forward on how to improve the lives of first responders.

“My colleagues and I hope to do more to specify common and also different stressors across the first responder professions, with the goal of developing best practices that include prevention and intervention strategies for the first responder and those closest to them. We know that stress/trauma injuries can impact critical thinking, logic, and decision making, as well as emotional regulation, which means that it most certainly can and does impact first responders’ ability to do their jobs.”

“Our goal is to help build and maintain a healthy, resilient workforce – one that allows people to effectively confront systemic challenges, adapt and serve their communities, and maintain their personal lives so that they not only make it to retirement, but can enjoy that time period of their life.”



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
