2017-2018 Graduate Admission Criteria & Requirements

Thank you for your interest in Marymount University. Please apply online at www.marymount.edu/apply. The following items are required:

- A \$40 nonrefundable application fee. (Applicants to the Doctor of Physical Therapy program will apply online at www.ptcas.org and pay a \$30 fee.) You may pay with a credit card, using our secure online payment system.
- Official transcripts for all college/university course work completed, send directly to Marymount University's Office of Graduate Enrollment Services, 2807 N. Glebe Road, Arlington, VA 22207, or via an online delivery system.
 - For university coursework completed outside the United States, an official course-by-course evaluation of your transcript is required from an approved evaluation agency in lieu of submitting an official transcript: World Education Services, Inc. (www.wes.org), and Educational Credential Evaluators (ECE) (www.ece.org) are approved evaulators. Please contact Graduate Enrollment Services for other options.

Nondegree applicants simply indicate a program of interest on the online application and submit official transcript(s) showing a Bachelor's degree awarded.

Degree and certificate applicants should consult the grid that follows for additional criteria, including:

 Application deadlines - Some programs operate on a rolling admissions policy, and some have specific deadlines.
 Applicants will be notified of the admissions decision once all application materials and credentials are received and the file review has been completed.

- Recommendations Some programs require two
 or more recommendations. If other directions aren't
 specified under "additional requirements," then
 recommenders should please use the online form
 to submit two recommendations that speak directly
 to the applicant's academic and interpersonal skills.
- Test scores Some programs require a standardized test score, which should be sent directly to Marymount.
 This requirement is waived for applicants (with the exception of D.P.T.) who hold a master's degree from an accredited college or university.
 - Nonnative speakers of English must submit a satisfactory score from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), the international English Language Testing System (IELTS), or the Pearson Test of English Academics (PTE). Conditional admission is an option for international graduate applicants who meet all admission requirements except demonstrated English proficiency and are enrolled in one of Marymount University's Partner Language Institutes. As set by the Virginia Department of Education, passing scores on the following: 1) the Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators Test - MATH ONLY (test code = 5732), minimum score of 150 (Praxis Core Math exam may be waived with a sufficient SAT/ACT math score - contact Graduate Admissions for details); and 2) the Virginia Communication and Literacy Assessment (VCLA) - A minimum score of 235 is required on each subtest for a combined score of 470. Additional admission requirements must be met to meet requirements of the Council for Interior Design Accreditation (CIDA). The applicant's transcript must show a minimum of 30 credits of liberal arts and sciences coursework in such disciplines as English composition, literature, foreign language, history, sociology, mathematics, biology, philosophy, humanities, psychology, and economics. Coursework in professional disciplines, such as business, cannot be included in this total. Applicants with fewer than 30 credits in the required coursework will be expected to make up the deficit before portfolio review.
