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2019-2020 Marymount University Fact Book Executive Summary

Perspectives: The Marymount University Fact Book provides current and historical university data on student enrollment, applicants, retention and graduation, faculty and instruction, and institutional finances. Data are consistent with official reporting requirements of federal, state, and private requestors. This executive summary provides a snapshot of Marymount's current student body and recent trends in the following categories.

Marymount's Fall 2019 Student Body:

- There were 3,363 students enrolled for credit, generating 3,045 credit FTEs.
- The student body consisted of 64% undergraduates and 36% graduates.
- Students represented 46 states (including D.C.) and 76 foreign countries.

Undergraduates:

- 90% of undergraduates were enrolled full-time.
- 65% were female.
- 49% were members of racial/ethnic minority groups and 16% were international students.
- 69% were commuter students.
- The average age was 22 years old.
- 38% of undergraduates with an identified religion were Roman Catholic.
- Undergraduates represented 39 states (including D.C.) and 72 foreign countries.
- The largest programs by enrollment were:
 - o Nursing (B.S.N.)
 - Business Administration (B.B.A.)
 - o Information Technology (B.S.)
 - Psychology (B.A.)
 - o Criminal Justice (B.A.)

Graduates:

- 57% of all graduate students were enrolled full-time.
- 71% were female.
- 35% were members of racial/ethnic minority groups and 12% were international students.
- The average age was 31 years old.
- 37% of graduate students with an identified religion were Roman Catholic.
- Graduate students represented 39 states (including D.C.) and 28 foreign countries.
- 81% of graduate students are pursuing a master's degree and 17% are in a doctoral program.
- The largest programs by enrollment were:
 - o Forensic and Legal Psychology (M.A.)
 - o Counseling (M.A.)
 - o Physical Therapy (D.P.T.)
 - o Cybersecurity (M.S.)
 - o Business Administration (M.A.)

Five-Year Trends in Enrollment:

- Marymount's overall headcount remained equal to the Fall 2015 level of 3,363.
- Total credit FTE increased 1% from 3,042 to 3,045 since Fall 2015.
- In Fall 2019 the proportion of overall full-time student enrollment remained consistent with prior years at 78% of total enrollment.

Undergraduates:

- Part-time undergraduate enrollment decreased 12% over the last five years, and the undergraduate credit FTE dropped from 2,217 to 2,059.
- Since Fall 2015 there was a 12% decrease in undergraduate campus residency.
- The School of Business and Technology increased undergraduate enrollment over the last five years by 3%, whereas the School of Design, Arts, and Humanities decreased by 20%.
- Hispanic undergraduate student enrollment increased 21% since Fall 2015, while all other minorities decreased over the period and white students also fell by 29%.
- Undergraduate enrollment of students from Virginia declined 11% since Fall 2015.
- International undergraduate student enrollment increased 27% between Fall 2015 and Fall 2019.

Graduates:

- The overall graduate headcount increased 16% to a five-year high of 1,205.
- Full-time graduate student enrollment increased by 26% from Fall 2015 to Fall 2019.
- Campus residency of graduate students more than doubled from 37 to 78 over the last five years.
- Graduate student enrollment in doctoral programs grew 35% since Fall 2015.
- Enrollment of male graduate students increased 33% since Fall 2015.
- Since Fall 2015, Hispanic graduate student enrollment increased 49%, followed by a 42% increase in Asian graduate student enrollment.
- International graduate student enrollment increased 85% between Fall 2015 and Fall 2019.

Marymount's New Students:

First-College:

- 3,315 completed applications were submitted for Fall 2019.
 - o 81% of applicants were accepted by the university.
 - o 392 accepted applicants enrolled, resulting in a yield of 15%.
- Completed applications increased 55% since Fall 2015.
- The average high school GPA of the entering class was 3.30.
- For enrolled first-college cohorts, the average SAT scores used for Fall 2019 admissions decision were 531 for Evidence-Based Reading and Writing and 528 for Math.
- 65% of first-college students were campus residents in Fall 2019.
- The number of first-college students who commute has risen 21% over the last five years.
- Since Fall 2015, Hispanic first-college student enrollment increased 56%, followed by a 26% increase in Black undergraduate student enrollment.
- 33% of first-college students with an identified religion were Roman Catholic.
- First-college students represented 29 states (including D.C.) and 20 foreign countries.

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Transfer and Re-admitted Students:

- 575 completed applications were submitted for Fall 2019.
 - o 71% of applicants were accepted by the university.
 - o 152 accepted applicants enrolled, resulting in a yield of 37%.
- Credit FTE of transfer and re-admitted students decreased 35% since Fall 2015.
- 86% of transfer and re-admitted students were commuters.
- Despite the 15% decline over five years in international transfer and re-admitted students, the proportion of these international students increased from 17% to 23%.
- 28% of transfer and re-admitted students with an identified religion were Roman Catholic.
- Transfer and re-admitted students represented 7 states (including D.C.) and 21 foreign countries.

New Second Degree (Nursing) Students:

- 224 completed applications were submitted for Fall 2019.
 - o 65% of applicants were accepted by the university.
 - o 54 accepted applicants enrolled, resulting in a yield of 37%.
- Credit FTE of new second degree students decreased 32% since Fall 2015.
- 89% of new second degree students were female.
- The average age of the new second degree student was 26 years.
- New second degree students represented 8 states (including D.C.) and 1 foreign country.

New Graduate Students:

- 1,177 completed applications were submitted in Fall 2019.
 - o 78% of applicants were accepted by the university.
 - o 408 accepted applicants enrolled, resulting in a yield of 44%.
- Credit FTE of new graduate students increased 27% since Fall 2015.
- New graduate students rose by 59% in the School of Business and Technology since Fall 2015.
- Over the last five years, there was a 59% increase in new graduate male students.
- 30% of new graduate students with an identified religion were Roman Catholic.
- New graduate students represented 33 states (including D.C.) and 23 foreign countries.

Retention and Graduation Rates:

- Marymount's Fall 2018 to Fall 2019 entering first-college retention rate was 72%.
- Marymount's official graduation rate (based on the Fall 2012 cohort) was 57%.
- 964 degrees and certificates were awarded in academic year 2018-19.
- Despite an increase in first-college male students for Fall 2018, 62% of males retained from freshman to sophomore year compared to 78% of females.
- First-college, first generation students who started in Fall 2018 retained at a higher rate (73%) than those who are not first generation (71%).
- New transfer and re-admitted students who enter with freshman class standing are the least likely to retain compared to those who enter as upperclassmen.
- New transfer and re-admitted students as well as new graduate students who enroll full-time are much more likely to retain than those who enter as part-time students.
- Compared to first-college or new transfer and re-admitted students, new graduate students who live on campus are more likely to retain than those who commute.

Faculty and Instruction:

- Of the 165 full-time and 182 adjunct faculty in Fall 2019, 85% and 41% of these faculty, respectively, held the highest degree in their field.
- 52% of the full-time faculty were tenured as of Fall 2019, with 31% more on tenure track.
- 75% of the full-time faculty were female in Fall 2019.
- The five-year average class size was 16 for undergraduates and 12 for graduate students.
- Of the total credits generated in Fall 2019:
 - o 5,843 undergraduate and 2,799 graduate credits were in Business and Technology.
 - 7% of undergraduate and 29% of graduate credits were online.
 - o 10,500 undergraduate and 587 graduate credits were in Design, Arts, and Humanities.
 - 1% of undergraduate credits were online.
 - o 4,456 undergraduate and 2,614 graduate credits were in Health Professions.
 - 2% of undergraduate and 5% of graduate credits were online.
 - 8,077 undergraduate and 3,899 graduate credits were in Sciences, Mathematics, and Ed.
 - 6% of undergraduate and 6% of graduate credits were online.
- In an academic year (fall and spring), the *five-year average* of credits generated were:
 - o 11,667 undergraduate and 4,196 graduate credits in Business and Technology.
 - Average of 837 of undergraduate credits and 895 graduate credits were online.
 - o 22,688 undergraduate and 859 graduate credits in Design, Arts, and Humanities.
 - Average of 65 of undergraduate credits were online.
 - o 9,891 undergraduate and 4,328 graduate credits in Health Professions.
 - Average of 216 of undergraduate and 89 graduate credits were online.
 - 16,442 undergraduate and 7,255 graduate credits in Sciences, Mathematics, and Ed.
 - Average of 692 of undergraduate and 498 graduate credits were online.


Institutional Finances:

Tuition:

- In 2019-20, the tuition and fees rate for full-time undergraduates was \$32,850, an increase of about 4% from the previous year.
- Room and board for 2019-20 of \$13,575 increased 3% from the previous year.
- All program specific graduate tuition increased no more than 4% over the 2018-19 rates.
- 42% of Marymount expenses were dedicated to instruction in fiscal year 2017-18 (most recent IPEDS Finance Report), and 16% went towards academic support.

Financial Aid:

- 98% of full-time, degree-seeking first-college students received financial aid.
- 85% of full-time, degree-seeking undergraduates received financial aid.
- 69% of full-time, degree-seeking graduate students received financial aid.
- On average, 66% of graduating undergraduates who entered Marymount as first-college students borrowed to pay for school.
- Endowed grant and scholarship aid to undergraduates was about \$1.2 million for 2018-19, a 19% increase over the 2014-15 amount of student aid of this type.
- Based on preliminary figures for Fall 2019, full-time enrolled first-college students received an average award of \$23,947 in the form of grants and scholarships.
